***Because they steal your common sense***

3. Which of the evils pertains to high levels of attachment? (1)

***Moh***

4. Which virtue is an antidote to Ahankaar? (1)

***Humility***

5. Why is it important to overcome the 5 Evils? (2)

***So we can meditate on God and have pure love for Him***

6. Why did the Sant-Sipahee stop his sword mid-swing? (2)

***He remembered his Guru’s teachings and that he was only to fight in the name of Justice and never out of spite or anger.***

7. What Evil, other than Krodh, rose up in the Sant-Sipahee when his opponent spat in his face? Explain. (3)

***Ahankaar. He felt as though he had been insulted by his opponent which hurt his pride.***

8. How would contentment help you to overcome the Evils? (3)

***If you remain content in God's will, you will attain the strength to face anything.  
Genuinely wanting to remain in God's will helps one to keep the 5 evils at bay.***

9. Which Evils do you struggle with and what to you do to overcome these struggles? (4)  
***Students will give their own examples.***

10. Which of the Gurbani lines can be associated with the sakhi of the Sant-Sipahee?  
Explain. (4)
